**Subject:** ANNUAL REPORTING BY LICENCES OR PERMITS HOLDERS IN  
LINE WITH COMPLIANCE OF THE MINING CHARTER 2018

Dear Industry

All licenses and permits granted and issued in terms of the Diamonds Act and the Precious Metals Act, must comply with Broad-Based Socio-Economic Empowerment Charter (herein referred as Mining Charter, 2018) contemplated in terms of section 100 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act 2002 (Act No 28 of 2002), which the South African Diamond and Precious Metals Regulator (herein referred to as the 'Regulator') is required to consider when issuing licenses. A holder of a licence or permit issued in terms of the Diamonds Act or the Precious Metals Act must report annually using the designed template, its level of compliance with the Mining Charter 2018, to the Regulator, as from the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020

The Regulator shall monitor, verify and evaluate implementation, cognisant of the impact of material constraints that may result in the non-achievement of the set targets.

Kindly find the attached approved reporting templates which you have to complete and forward together with the requested information to the SADPMR within 21 upon receipt of this notice. All annual reports must be forwarded to the Licensing Department via email to [josephm@sadpmr.co.za](mailto:josephm@sadpmr.co.za) or through a courier service to **SADPMR, 251 Fox Street, Doornfontein, Johannesburg, 2001**. This procedure is in line with the Regulators approach to dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic and to ensure officials and license holders are kept safe.
